Public Participation:

7 members of the public were in attendance, all of whom were objecting against the planning application PA2026/416 for reasons including:

- The proposal goes against the Government's view on omissions
- Concerns regarding negative impact on the environment
- Increased traffic on Top Road
- Poor air quality as a result
- There is no dust monitoring proposals in place
- The parishioners feel there is a lack of information available and would have welcomed a consultation and asked if the company could attend a Parish Council meeting
- Has the rubbish been removed or partially removed?
- There is a gas pipeline running through the land
- Can the company guarantee the heaps of coal will not self ignite?
- There is no provision for run-off; there are no sewers just a septic tank
- Concerns regarding health issues for residents and exasperated pre-existing medical conditions
- The residents would like North Lincolnshire Council to request some way of monitoring the impact of the dust

EA2606/3 Planning - PA2026/416

The Councillors, as agreed at the last meeting, looked at this and emailed comments to the Clerk who was approved at the meeting to reply within the 21 days under devolved power. The Chair however decided to call an extraordinary meeting to get the views of the parishioners due to the strong objections of the Parish Council.

Proposed: Cllr Boyington, seconded: Cllr Woollass

Resolved: North Killingholme Parish Council strongly object to this application due to the negative effect this will have on the environment and local residents. The proximity of a water pipeline is 20m and a gas pipeline runs through the site and have concerns about the coal and possible self igniting. 7 local residents attended the Parish Council meeting and contributed to the public participation section with all 7 strongly objecting to this application. Increased traffic and HGVs would be on Top Road which is already identified as an accident hotspot and area of significant speeding.

We object due to the lack of information and will continue to object until we have received clarification on this proposal and clarification on the removal or part-removal of rubbish.

North Killingholme is a village with an older population and the Parish Council have concerns about the impact this will have on the health of the population, especially those with asthma, COPD and breathing difficulties.

North Killingholme Parish Council would like North Lincolnshire Council to monitor the impact this would have including noise, vibrations, and dust. The objection from NKPC is also due to the application not being clear as to how the applicant will deal with surplus and surface contaminated water
